# **Risk Appraisal Process Overview**



## **OUR APPROACH**

The CRICO Risk Appraisal Process (RAP) and Service Line Risk Assessment (SLRA) is part of CRICO's comprehensive risk assessment offerings. The RAP focuses on an entire organization while the SLRA focuses on specific departments with the aim of recognizing three critical elements that enhances patient and staff safety: Structure, Culture, and Leadership.

Our approach combines qualitative and quantitative evaluation to provide an in-depth understanding of the strengths and opportunities of an organization or service line. We engage with front-line staff, providers, and management. The goal is to offer organizations an expanded view of current patient safety risk, to identify process gaps and provide improvement opportunities to help prioritize patient safety work.

### **OUR PROCESS**

The process includes four phases:

#### Phase 1: Kick-off meeting

Meeting with leadership to review goals/objectives of the program.

#### **Phase 2: Review of materials**

The RAU will request preliminary data. The CRICO team will review all submitted information.

The following documents may be requested by the CRICO team prior to the assessment. These may include, but are not limited to, the following:

- Joint Commission
- Department of Public Health
- HCAHPS/Press Ganey
- Staff satisfaction survey
- Culture of safety survey
- Prior risk assessment
- Relevant policies

#### Phase 3: Visit

**On-site interviews** are conducted with leadership, management, and frontline staff within the department. We also **observe the clinical area** to gain insight and understanding of a department's procedures and practices, looking specifically at those systems that impact patient and staff safety.

#### Phase 4: Results

A comprehensive report of the findings and recommendations will be provided within 12 weeks. Information and specific responses obtained from interviews will remain anonymous and be shared in aggregate <u>only</u>. CRICO's risk assessment team returns to the organization to present the overall findings in a workshop format and facilitates a dialogue regarding improvement opportunities.
