Submitting a Moonlighting Waiver

WHEN TO SUBMIT A MOONLIGHTING WAIVER:

- Only needed for residents and fellows
- If they are practicing at a clinical site <u>outside</u> of the CRICO network <u>when it is not</u> part of their residency or fellowship program

WHEN SUBMITTING A MOONLIGHTING WAIVER, THE FOLLOWING IS REQUIRED:

- Waiver must be signed by Chief of Service
- · Residents and Fellows must have a full medical license to moonlight in Massachusetts
 - o If practicing out-of-state, must have a license to practice in that state
- Emergency Room moonlighting is only covered if the:
 - o Resident is enrolled in Harvard-affiliated Emergency Medicine Residency Program
 - Resident and Fellow must both have PALS or ACLS and ATLS certifications

Important Points

- If an OB/GYN resident or fellow is moonlighting as an Attending physician, they will be charged the attending rate
- If the clinical extension site is providing malpractice liability coverage or if it is covered by the Federal Tort Claims Act (FTCA), a moonlighting waiver is not required since CRICO coverage is not needed.
